

Job offer: Science officer of the Office for Climate Education Starting: June 1st, 2023

Context

Established in March 2018, the *Office for Climate Education* (OCE) is a foundation under the auspices of UNESCO and the *La main à la pâte* Foundation. The OCE has been, since 2021, an observer member of the IPCC.

Its mission is to promote and develop climate change education. The OCE conducts educational projects in France, in Europe and in Latin America, and plans to implement projects in Africa and South-East Asia soon.

The OCE coordinates a large network of national and international actors (about 70 scientific and educational institutions and NGOs) to support primary and secondary school teachers with quality educational resources and professional development.

The OCE's operational team is currently composed of 10 people (9 permanent and 1 intern). It is based in Paris (France), in the premises of Sorbonne University (Jussieu campus), close to the Pierre-Simon Laplace Institute (IPSL).

Job offer

Under the responsibility of the Operations Manager of the OCE, the Science officer participates notably to the development of educational resources, the professional development of teachers and the design of educational projects.

- **Type of contract:** Permanent contract, full time, 39 hours per week
- **Employer:** Fondation *La main à la pâte*
- **Start date:** June 2023
- **Monthly salary:** 3 395€ gross + social benefits (health insurance 70% / restaurant vouchers / public transport fees 50%)
- **Workplace:** *Office for Climate Education*, Sorbonne-University, Jussieu campus, Paris 75005 (France). Partial teleworking possible.

The position requires occasional short-term travel in France and abroad.

Missions

- Participation in the production of educational resources (teacher summaries of IPCC reports, classroom activities, scientific insights, video clips, multimedia animations, serious games, MOOCs, etc.) for teachers, trainers and students in primary and secondary schools.
- Coordination of thematic working groups gathering national and international partners.
- Organization and facilitation of trainings, conferences, summer schools... for teachers, trainers, and institutions, in France and abroad.
- Coordination of discussions with scientific and pedagogical partners of projects.
- Assistance in the setting up of educational projects in France and abroad (definition of project components, scientific and pedagogical contents, identification of partners, etc.).

Qualifications

- Scientific background (Masters, PhD...) in climate or environmental sciences with an excellent knowledge of climate change issues and a strong interest in interdisciplinarity.
- Ability and interest in face-to-face interactions (conferences, trainings, webinars...).
- Solid experience in scientific mediation or education.
- Fluency in English, both written and spoken.
- Excellent writing skills.
- Experience in setting up and managing projects.
- International experience would be a plus, particularly in Latin America, Africa or Asia.
