

Job offer: Science officer of the Office for Climate Education Starting: June 1st, 2022

Context

Established in March 2018, the *Office for Climate Education* (OCE) is a foundation under the auspices of UNESCO and the *La main à la pâte* Foundation. The OCE has been, since 2021, an observer member of the IPCC.

Its mission is to promote and develop climate change education. The OCE conducts educational projects in France, in Europe and in Latin America, and plans to implement projects in Africa and South-East Asia soon.

The OCE coordinates a large network of national and international actors (about 70 scientific and educational institutions and NGOs) to support primary and secondary school teachers with quality educational resources and professional development.

The OCE's operational team is currently composed of 11 people (8 permanent and 3 interns). It is based in Paris (France), in the premises of Sorbonne University (Jussieu campus), close to the Pierre-Simon Laplace Institute (IPSL).

Job offer

Under the responsibility of the Executive Director of the OCE, the Science officer participates notably to the development of educational resources, the professional development of teachers and the design of educational projects.

- **Monthly salary:** 3 200€ gross + social benefits (mutual insurance 70% / restaurant vouchers / public transport fees 50%)
- **Workplace:** *Office for Climate Education*, Sorbonne-University, Jussieu campus, Paris 75005 (France). Partial teleworking possible.

The position requires occasional short-term travel in France and abroad.

Missions

- Within the framework of two European projects on climate modelling and extreme events (ESM2025 and XAIDA) as well as the publication of the 6th IPCC Assessment Report, the science officer will:
 - Develop various educational resources for primary and secondary school teachers (science communication, teaching guide, video clips, multimedia animations, serious games, MOCC, etc.)
 - Organize and facilitate a variety of events (conferences, training workshops, summer universities...) in France and abroad
 - Coordinate exchanges with scientific partners
- In collaboration with the OCE strategy and partnerships officer, the science officer will support the design of pedagogical projects for various countries (project design, scientific and pedagogical contents, fund raising...)

Qualifications

- **PhD in climate science** with an excellent knowledge of climate change issues and a strong interest in interdisciplinarity
- Strong skills in science mediation and/or science education
- Fluency in English (Fluency in French will also be an asset)
- Excellent writing skills
- Experience in project management
